WRLP provides **FREE**

Workforce Development training to economically Impacted individuals in Guilford County. Training consists of **(3)** three weeks of core classes and up to **(12)** twelve-weeks of skills training and internship experiences.

Job Training

Core Classes include:

- ◆ Effective Communication
- ◆ Personal Development
- ◆ Using Computers for Job Search
- ◆ Money Smarts
- ◆ TABE and CRC Prep.

Core classes **must** be completed prior to starting the training programs.

- ✓ 18+ years of age
- ✓ High School Diploma/GED
- ◆ Don't have a Diploma/GED WE CAN HELP!
- ✓ Guilford County Resident
- ✓ At or below 125% of Federal Poverty Levels
(This includes **all** household members related by blood or marriage).

There are a limited number of training slots for each training class.


Please bring the following information to the session:

You may attend a session without all of the documentation above but will not be considered for the program until all eligibility information is provided.





